6:45 am Meet local tour ambassador and depart from Duke Energy Convention Center – exit doors located near Exhibit Hall C.

7:15 am Depart for Greenville, OH (95 miles). Quick comfort stop en route.

9:30 am Arrive for a guided tour through the **KitchenAid Factory** where over two million KitchenAid stand mixers were made last year. This is the mixer every household would love to have. This will be a one hour walking tour through the KitchenAid historical display area, machine shop, powder paint area, sub-assembly building, shipping, and life test lab. You will also see the customer service center. **PLEASE NOTE: NO OPEN TOED OR BACKLESS SHOES ALLOWED. THIS IS THE ONLY TOUR OF THE FACTORY OF THE DAY.**



11:30 am Next a stop at the **KitchenAid Experience** in historic downtown Greenville. You will find yourself surrounded by all colors of KitchenAid mixers and many gadgets to buy. You will have experts help as you make apple dumplings. They will be baking while you are having lunch. This will be your dessert when you pick up your dumpling with ice cream after lunch.



12:15 pm Lunch is on your own in **historic downtown Greenville**, a member of Heritage Ohio and a State and Nationally Accredited Main Street Program. Just a few blocks away from the KitchenAid Experience you'll find these local restaurants: Montage Café, Danny's Place Sports Bar & Grill, D'Alessios Italian inspired cuisine, Double M Diner and others in addition to quaint locally owned shops.



1:15 pm Back to the **KitchenAid Experience** to pick up your dessert and shop. This is the only place in the world where you can purchase every KitchenAid appliance in every color made. For the history buffs, there's also a display of antique KitchenAid memorabilia dating back to the early years.

2:00 pm

Depart for the **Garst Museum and Annie Oakley Center**, which has the world's most extensive collection of artifacts of Ohio natives "sure-shot" **Annie Oakley** and early broadcaster **Lowell Thomas**. Also in the museum, you will find how General Anthony Wayne forged a treaty with local Indian tribes to open the Northwest Territory to settlement. Throughout the facility there will be docents to answer questions.



3:45 pm

Depart for **Bear's Mill**, built in 1849 by Gabriel Baer, is one of the last operating water-powered mills in Ohio



today. You'll learn how the mill really works, from the hydro-powered turbines, to the cups and belts that carry the grain from floor to floor, right down to the final, healthy end product. Time will be provided to shop in the **Market at Bear's Mill**, which carries an eclectic mix of Bear's Mill flours and meals, gourmet food items, coffee, teas, home goods, clothing, jewelry and unique gift items and specialty baked goods that are delivered weekly to the market, including artisan breads from the Bakehouse Bread & Cookie Company, as well as delicious locally made confections and sweets that utilize Bear's Mill's stone ground flours and meals.

4:30 pm

Depart for Cincinnati, OH (92 miles).

6:30 pm

ETA to Duke Energy Convention Center.

This tour needs a minimum of 35 guest, per date, to operate. Maximum is 50.

Please wear comfortable CLOSED TOED shoes and clothing as there will be lots of walking. You will not be permitted on the KitchenAid Factory tour with inappropriate footwear.
